

The Lupus Foundation of America, in partnership with Exagen Inc., conducted a 25-question retrospective cross-sectional online survey among 1,313 people with lupus to examine barriers to lupus diagnosis and care.

Respondents faced many healthcare challenges from the time they first saw a doctor for their symptoms. Healthcare-related challenges associated with delayed diagnosis included:

Other barriers associated with delayed lupus diagnosis and care include insurance not covering the costs of needed services and long wait times to for an appointment with a primary care provider.





ADDRESSING BARRIERS AND CHALLENGES

- An ongoing shortage of rheumatologists may further magnify the delay in diagnosis and explain the apparent long wait times for specialists, misdiagnosis, and increasing costs.
- Further practitioner education, rheumatology provider recruitment, and studies examining reasons for lupus diagnosis delays may help us better understand and reduce inequities in reaching a prompt lupus diagnosis.
